THE GOSPEL TO THE ROMANS

The Offense of the Gospel

Rom 9:24-33; 10:1-4

- 1. The calling of True Israel—his argument for God not failing: vs 24-25
 - a. I will call them my people, "My beloved" Who are they? vs 24/Rom 8:28/John 5:25
 - b. Called "The children of the living God" Who are they? vs 24/1 Cor 1:21-24
 - c. Typified clearly in our Exodus narrative—Jew/Gentile: Ex 12:38
 - d. The Mystery of the Church revealed: Eph 3:1-8

2. A remnant of Jews preserved in mercy: vs 26-29

- a. The Apostle's argument in Rom 11:3-5
- b. The prophecy of a remnant from Jeremiah: Jer 50:20

3. He delineates clearly the wonder of the Gentile's Salvation: vs 30

- a. And the Tragic failure of the Jews who followed and failed: vs 31
- b. He gives us both the reason and the cause in vs 32-33
- 4. The offense of the gospel is the person and work of Christ: Luke 7:23
 - a. <u>*His Person*</u> is offensive because He is the sole exclusive means to God: John 14:6
 - b. <u>His work</u> is offensive because it is a rejection of all human effort: Gal 2:16/Tit 3:5

5. God purposely made Him a stumbling stone: vs 32b, 33a/ Isa 28:16

- a. What is a stumbling stone "a cause of offense, trap, snare", plague/to strike
- b. The prophecy of Isaiah and the Psalms: Isa 8:14-18/Ps 118:22
- c. And Christ's own warnings: Mt 21:42-46/Luke7:23; 20:18
- d. Peter affirms the same: 1 Pet 2:4, 7
- 6. Salvation is faith in the stumbling stone: 32b
 - a. To believe in this stumbling stone is to be crushed by its claims:
 1 Cor 1:26-29
 - b. To believe in this stumbling stone is to be called by its promise: Acts 2:39-41
 - c. To believe in this stumbling stone is to be kept by its power: Rom 10:11-13
