THE GOSPEL TO THE ROMANS

"Foreknown, Predestined, and Called"

Romans 8:26-31

- 1. He leads us through them: Rom 8:14
- 2. He helps us overcome our sins by calling us back to the cross and repentance: Rom 8:15
- 3. He reminds and affirms us that we are sons of God, as He did Christ: Rom 8:16
- 4. He teaches us to embrace suffering and trials and oppositions to the gospel: Rom 8:17
- 5. He enters deeply into our prayer life to assist us to pray successfully in the trials: Rom 8:26-27
- 1. Foreknown—Pro-gnosko—6x (For God to foreknow is for Him to fore-love)
 - a. This is a <u>special knowledge</u>- not mere awareness: Rom 11:2/1 Pet 1:20/ 2 Pet 3:17
 - b. He does not know the ungodly and the wicked <u>in this way</u>. Mt 7:23/ Luke 13:24-28
 - c. Those known this way are His elect who *will be called to purpose*: Rom 8:28/2 Thess 2:13-14
- 2. **PREDESTINED:** "to determine beforehand"—to mark out for a purpose. A plan and purpose previously devised: Acts 4:28/1 Cor 2:7/Eph 1:7, 11
 - a. Predestination has its termination: not a place, but a person—"Christ"
 - b. Predestination, therefore, does not affirm an election to hell: Rev 20:11-15
 - c. Hell is the consequence of willing and unrepentant sin. Rom 6:23/John 8:23-24, 31-32
- 3. Conformity to Jesus Christ is our sonship and calling: vs 29
 - a. We are called to conformity to Christ: Gal 4:9/Phil 1:27-30
 - b. What He endured for us is what, in part, we are to endure for Him: Rom 8:17
 - c. The gospel call is to freedom, suffering, and glory! Rom 8:18
